- ◆ Have you been collecting the history of your ancestors for many years?
- ◆ Do you have all the family research stored in your home?
- ◆ Are you the gatekeeper for the family stories, the photos, and the documents?

If you answered yes to the questions above,
then isn't it time to write your family history?

If you have been thinking about starting but aren't sure how to proceed, we invite you to spend an intensive four days with published authors and local teachers who will help you take your first steps toward writing and publishing.

REGISTRATION INCLUDES:

- ◆ Four full days of classes taught by experienced teachers and authors and a class taught by a local publisher
- ◆ Hands-on sessions each day so you can apply the skills you have learned
- ◆ Individual consultations throughout the workshop
- ◆ Morning coffee, lunch, and light snacks each day
- ◆ Notebook of handouts, booklets, and a bibliography

The Institute will be held at the StLGS office from 9 a.m. until 3 p.m. each day.

~ You should also bring a flash/stick drive on which to save computer files.

CLASS REQUIREMENTS

- ❖ Participants need to submit a biography of 500 words or less on a deceased person, preferably from St. Louis, if possible.
- ❖ Your biography **must include** at least **two source citations**.
- ❖ Your original file should be in MS Word or Pages for the Mac and you should plan to bring your electronic file with you on your laptop or a flash/stick drive.
- ❖ Your writing will be shared, so if you have family secrets you don't want public, it is best to omit them. If you choose, by the end of the week, your biography will be ready for publication on the StLGS website in our Missouri Bicentennial project, St. Louis City/County Biographies.

THE INSTRUCTORS

Viki Fagyal is a lifelong St. Louis resident who has been researching her family for more than thirty years. A writer, genealogy instructor, and lecturer, Viki completed a book on her father's family history in 2013, a book on St. Louis Orphanages in 2018, and is currently writing a book on her mother's family.

Jane (Soehngen) Theissen holds an MLIS (library) degree from the University of Missouri-Columbia and retired in 2018 as a reference librarian from Fontbonne University. She is co-editor of the *StLGS Quarterly*. She was bitten by the genealogy bug in high school as the result of a history class assignment and, with her mom, has been researching her family since then.



THE SCHEDULE

1. Each day's schedule begins promptly at 9:00 a.m. and ends at approximately 3:00 p.m.
2. All classes are at the StLGS office—4 Sunnen Dr., Suite 140, Maplewood, Mo.
3. Classes are hands-on and participatory; students should plan to complete short assignments during the afternoons or overnight.
4. Ongoing throughout the week, instructors will meet daily with all participants to discuss writing assignments, suggest improvements, provide direction, and offer proofreading and editing recommendations.

- ❖ **Monday**—Overview and get acquainted meeting. Lectures on beginning your writing, using timelines and historical context, learning some new rules of English, and beginning source citations
- ❖ **Tuesday**—Lectures on genealogy writing basics, style sheets, using Microsoft Word, and more on source citations
- ❖ **Wednesday**—Lectures on the parts of a book/layout, working with graphics, using maps, and indexing
- ❖ **Thursday**—Lectures on lessons learned from publishing, ethics and copyright, polishing your final draft, and the nitty-gritty of publishing



ALL THE REST

1. Participants need to provide their own transportation to and from the StLGS office.
2. If you are coming from out of town, let us know and we will provide some suggestions for hotels and meals. There are several very nice (and reasonably priced) hotels within a five-mile radius of the office.
3. Hotels, transportation, and meals (other than lunch) are NOT included in the registration fee.
4. **Cancellation Policy:** Any booking cancelled before 15 June will incur no penalty. After 16 June, there is a \$50 non-refundable cancellation fee. After 1 July, no money can be refunded unless the class space can be filled.
